Guild AGM The Precentor, Canon Nick Brown presided over the Service in the ringers' chapel and the AGM meeting. Between these two events was a lovely lunch provided by the Southern branch. The Precentor thanked all Guild ringers for their ringing around the Diocese. The usual business of the AGM went swiftly with rule changes and accounts agreed without dissent. After many years, the post of Training and Recruitment Officer has been filled by David Braunton, Jonathan Clarke has agreed to once again be webmaster and Christine Higginson was appointed Safeguarding Advisor and will be carrying out a review of the Guild's policy. Reports of all the activities of the 125th anniversary year were described by the Master, Keith Butter, which had all been highly successful. The Northern Branch were declared the winners of the 125 firsts challenge – with 529 firsts recorded during the year. Their enthusiasm was applauded. All branches easily exceeded the 125 target. A higher level of grants has been given out during the anniversary year than for many years and fundraisers for the BRF were commended. Chris Sharp was thanked for his very busy and productive stint as Guild Sec but unfortunately no-one has come forward yet to replace him.
