On Sunday 8 May 2010 St. James Church, Great Grimsby was "Promoted" to Minster status by the Bishop of Lincoln. After the Bishop had handed over the Official Documents and the congregation had applauded the whole church became silent. This was the signal for the bells to peal out over Grimsby to announce the creation of the new Minster. After a Plain Course of Grandsire the service recommenced. The Bishop stated that it was the first time that he had had the pleasure of making a Parish Church a Minster.
